RE-ORGANIZATION

O'Brien finds new job in school district amalgamations

District 10 School Superintendent Derek O'Brien has a new job.

Under the provincial restructuring of New Brunswick school districts, O'Brien is now the director of curriculum and instruction for the new school district of Anglophone South.

"My sole responsibility will be education and learning," said O'Brien. "My work will be directly with teachers on the education side.

"It's a new challenge. I've always loved working with teachers and this gives me full time focus on that and that will be good."

His new job will begin July 1 with the amalgamation of school districts 6, 8 and 10. The district is still functioning as school district 10 until then.

O'Brien will report to and travel between three educational centres in the new school district. Those centres will be in St. Stephen, Saint John and Hampton.

In his job as superintendent, O'Brien was responsible for 16 schools. His new job encompasses teachers in 74 schools.

In announcing the re-organization in May, Education Minister Jody Carr said it would result in staff reductions with a savings of \$2.4 million in 2012-2013, a savings the provincial government will reinvest in schools. Sixty-five positions will be displaced, mainly in administration and none in the classroom.

The re-organization has combined the former nine Anglophone districts into four districts.

Zoe Watson, the assistant deputy minister on leave as superintendent from Rothesay's School District 6, has been named the superintendent of the Anglophone South district.

O'Brien said he is not expecting the transition to the new school district to create any disruptions.

"School will open on schedule," he stated, adding that the public can continue to access support from the district at the St. Stephen Education Centre which will be housed in the old District 10 offices on School Street.

Subject coordinators and learning specialists will continue to work out of local education centre.

He said other former school district positions have stayed "relatively the same."

O'Brien said Moira Sherwood, who previously looked after technology and trades in District 10 will continue in that position, but is now responsible for all schools in Anglophone South.

Jennie MacDougall, director of education, is now the senior education officer for the St. Stephen Education centre.

"We're still waiting (word) on some of the management pieces," said O'Brien. Yet to be appointed are a transportation manager and an assistant facilities manager for the local education centre.

O'Brien said as superintendent he spends a lot of time on the management side of things. Now he won't be responsible for keeping the buses running and for things like building maintenance.

He noted it was a busy time of year in the schools and in the district with exam schedules, high school graduations and school closing concerts combined with the transition from District 10 to Anglophone South.

Adex Mining hoping to begin production at Mount Pleasant as soon as possible

The chair of the board of Adex Mining, Yan Kim Po, says the company is hoping to proceed with production at Mount Pleasant Mine as soon as possible.

The company held its annual and special meeting of shareholders earlier this month in Fredericton. The shareholders re-elected Norman Betts, William Burton, Joseph Ying Kit Lau, Linda Lam Kwan, Yan Kim Po and Joe Kin Foon Tai to serve as members of the board of directors.

They also re-approved the company's rolling stock option plan and re-appointed Price Waterhouse Coopers as the company's auditors. Yan will serve as the chairman and Betts as the lead independent director of the board. Lam Kwan will continue to serve in the position of interim president and chief executive officer while Adex has accepted the resignation, effective June 30, of Patrick Merrin as the chief operating officer.

The company is actively pursuing the hiring of additional members for its senior management and technical teams. As at March 31, Adex had cash and cash equivalents of approximately \$3.9 million and the company is considering possible sources of additional financing, such as a rights offering, to be used for additional work on the Mount Pleasant Mine project.

Yan stated that, "I am pleased that, over the past year, the company has made significant progress with the Mount Pleasant Mine project. I am confident about the future prospects of Adex.

"We will continue to work to move the project forward and to proceed to the commencement of production as soon as possible. I want to thank the shareholders of Adex and the Government of New Brunswick for their ongoing support". Adex is a Canadian junior mining company focused on developing its flagship Mount Pleasant Mine Property, a multi-metal project that is host to promising tungsten-molybdenum and tin-indium-zinc mineralization.
